Dominican Republic Dominican Republic extends the curfew until June 13

With decree 188-20, President Danilo Medina ordered the following measures regarding the curfew and social distancing guidelines established to address the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic:

ARTICLE 1. All the social distancing measures adopted by the Executive Power since March 17 of this year are ratified and kept in force, including those that have been implemented by the High-Level Commission for the Prevention and Control of the Coronavirus, with its modifications, as well as the process of gradual reopening of economic activities started on May 20 of this year.

ARTICLE 2. The curfew is extended throughout the national territory until June 13 of the current year in the following manner:

- 1) Monday to Saturday from 7:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.
- 2) Sundays from 5:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

ARTICLE 3. We exhort the population to observe the social distancing measures recommended by the authorities and specialized agencies and, by virtue of this, to not leave their homes unless it is for strictly necessary purposes.
